

Julie's Helpers Memorial Scholarship Application Checklist



Application. Completed and Signed.

Certificate of Indian Blood. Original with official seal verifying legal Navajo Nation enrollment. Must be at least one-fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) degree Navajo Indian.

Transcripts. College, high school transcripts, and/or GED scores. First year college students must submit final high school transcript with date of graduation. Minimum cumulative GPA must be 2.75

Letter of Admission. Applicant must be admitted or enrolled in a full-time New Mexico college or university undergraduate program.

Enrollment Verification. A signed enrollment verification by school's signatory authority and current Class Schedule indicating full-time enrollment of twelve (12) or more credit hours.

One Page Letter. Please tell us about yourself. Specify your tribe, where you are from, your college or university and area of study, your goals and vision for yourself in 10 years. Explain how you plan to use your education to serve your community. Include a description of any personal or financial circumstances warranting consideration by the selection committee and list any other current scholarships. Letters must be typed in 12 pt font, single spaced, and signed.

One Photo of Applicant. Please provide a recent photo of yourself (may be used in conjunction with award announcement). Photos will not be returned.
